THE HAGUE, July 26, 1920.

YOUR EXCELLENCY,

With regard to the international regulation of goods traffic by rail, the French Government proposed to the various Governments concerned that the modifications contained in a provisional draft agreement drawn up at Paris on September 6, 1919, should be introduced.

This proposal gave rise to objections on the part of some of the Powers. For the present, therefore, only the mere renewal of the Berne Convention of October 14, 1890, and of its instruments

of ratification can be considered.

As the Government of the Republic is prepared to regard the above as renewed upon condition of three months' notice of denunciation being given, this denunciation to be made before September 30, at the latest in order to take effect on the following 1st of January, I should be obliged if Your Excellency would let me know whether Her Majesty's Government is prepared to agree to this proposal. In that case the present letter and Your Excellency's reply will be considered as confirming the agreement made in this sense between the two Governments.
