No. 248. — CONVENTION REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF THE EXTRADITION CONVENTION BETWEEN THE FORMER AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN MONARCHY AND THE NETHERLANDS CONCLUDED AT VIENNA NOVEMBER 24, 1880, TO THE EXTRADITION BETWEEN AUSTRIA AND THE NETHERLANDS, SIGNED AT THE HAGUE, DECEMBER 1, 1921.

French official text communicated by the Netherlands Chargé d'affaires at Berne. The Registration of this Convention took place on March 20 1922.

Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands and the President of the Austrian Republic, being anxious to obtain the application of the treaty for the extradition of criminals concluded on November 24, 1880, between the Netherlands and the former Austro-Hungarian Monarchy, pending the conclusion of a new treaty between their two countries for the extradition of criminals, have resolved to conclude an agreement to this effect and have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN OF THE NETHERLANDS:

The Jonkheer Ch. J. M. Ruys de Beerenbrouck, Netherlands Minister for the Interior, entrusted with the conduct of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs;

The President of the Austrian Republic:

M. F. Calice, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Austrian Republic at the Court of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands;

Who, after exchanging their full powers found in good and due form, agreed upon the following articles:

Article T.

The treaty for the extradition of criminals concluded between the Netherlands and the former Austro-Hungarian Monarchy on November 24, 1880, shall be applied by the High Contracting Parties.

Article 2.

The present Convention shall come into force on the day after the exchange of ratifications. It shall remain in force until one of the High Contracting Parties notifies the other, giving six months notice in advance of its intention to terminate the Convention.

Article 3.

The present Convention shall be ratified as soon as possible and the ratifications shall be exchanged at The Hague.

In witness whereof the plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention.
