No. 1802. — SECOND ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT TO THE COMMERCIAL TREATY CONCLUDED AT BUDAPEST, FEBRUARY 8, 1922, BETWEEN-THE REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA AND THE KINGDOM OF HUNGARY. SIGNED AT VIENNA, JUNE 14, 1928.

The President of the Federal Republic of Austria and His Serene Highness the Regent of Hungary, being desirous of modifying and supplementing certain clauses of the Agreement signed at Vienna on April 9, 1926, as an addition to the Commercial Treaty between the Republic of Austria and the Kingdom of Hungary, signed at Budapest on February 8, 1922, have therefore resolved to conclude a second additional Agreement and have for this purpose appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

THE PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA:

Dr. Hans Schürff, Federal Minister of Commerce and Transport,

Andreas Thaler, Federal Minister of Agriculture and Forestry;

HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF HUNGARY:

Count Ludwig Ambrózy of Séden and Remete, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Vienna,

Who, after having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following provisions:

Article I.

Appendix A (to the Austrian Customs Tariff) of the Additional Agreement of April 9, 1926, shall be modified as follows:

Article III.

The Final Protocol of the additional Agreement of April 9, 1926, shall be modified as follows:

(a) To be deleted:

The notes to the Austrian Customs Tariff under Nos. 31, 31 (a) and 31 (c); The second paragraph of the notes to the Hungarian Customs Tariff under Nos. 643, 645 a and 653 a, beginning with the words: "upon the expiration of another half-year." The notes under Nos. 496 a and 628 shall also be deleted.

(b) To be modified:

The note under No. 40a of the Austrian Customs Tariff, to read as follows: The Austrian Government undertakes to apply to dried paprika pods, No. 40a. I in the tariff a duty of not less than 10 gold kronen so long as the present Agreement remains in force.

(c) To be added:

- I. To the notes to the Austrian Customs Tariff:
- Ad No. 75: Pumpkin oil (or pumpkin seed oil) is an oil having slight siccative properties which is obtained from the seeds of various kinds of field pumpkins. In the crude, unrefined state, it is thick and its colour varies between yellowish green and reddish brown; it has a peculiar sweetish taste.
 - Ad No. 97 (b): Fine meat sausages; it shall be understood that any reduction in the duty on cooked meat sausages made entirely or chiefly of beef, which might be granted by Austria later to a third State, shall also apply to the sausages of the salami quality mentioned in Article I (c).
 - Ad 189 (a): This number includes polishing discs made of thick felt, heavy and coarse-haired, of 200 mm. minimum diameter and 25 mm. minimum thickness.
 - Ad No. 220 (a) I: Untrimmed straw hats for men and boys: hats trimmed merely with a straw band shall bear the same duty under this Agreement as untrimmed hats for men and boys.
 - Ad No. 231: This number does not include floor rugs and mats made of coconut fibre.
 - Ad No. 302 (b) (2) and 303: Furniture made of solid beech wood: component parts of soft wood or the combined use of soft wood and beech wood shall not prevent furniture of solid beech wood from being dutiable at the Conventional rate.
- 2. To the notes to the Hungarian Customs Tariff:
 - Ad No. 277 (b): Bicarbonate of soda, if technically pure, shall be taxed according to this tariff number; bicarbonate of soda in casks or large cases without inner packing shall not be considered as chemically pure bicarbonate of soda.
 - Ad No. 589 a: This tariff number includes polishing discs made of thick heavy felt of coarse hair, of 200 mm. minimum diameter and 25 mm. minimum thickness.

Article IV.

The present Agreement shall remain in force for one year from the date of its entry into force. It may be denounced in the first instance three months before the end of the first year, and subsequently at any time, subject to its remaining in force for three months from the date of denunciation. Article IV of the Additional Agreement of April 9, 1926, shall be modified in the sense that the right to denounce the said Additional Agreement, as well as the Commercial Treaty of February 8, 1922, which form an integral whole with the present Agreement, shall be suspended for one year from the date of entry into force of the present Agreement. The provisions agreed upon in respect of the denunciation of the present Agreement shall also apply to the two Agreements mentioned above.

Article V.

The present Agreement shall be ratified as soon as possible and the instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at Budapest. The Agreement shall come into force on the eighth day after the exchange of the instruments of ratification, but the two Governments reserve the right to put

the Agreement provisionally into force at an earlier date, following its acceptance by the Austrian and Hungarian Legislatures, respectively.

The Agreement is drawn up in duplicate, in German and in Hungarian.

In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Agreement and have thereto affixed their seals.

Done at Vienna, June 14, 1928.
