Additional Protocol to the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation signed at Rome, April 28, 1923, with Final Protocol. Signed at Rome, December 30, 1927.

No. 1964. — ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL <sup>2</sup> TO THE TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN AUSTRIA AND ITALY, SIGNED AT ROME, APRIL 28, 1923. SIGNED AT ROME, DECEMBER 30, 1927.

French official text communicated by the Italian Minister for Foreign Affairs. The registration of this Protocol took place March 4, 1929.

The undersigned, being duly authorised for the purpose, have agreed to modify and complete as follows the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between THE KINGDOM OF ITALY and THE REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA signed at Rome on April 28, 1923.

## III.

The Republic of Austria waives claim to the conventional duties established by the Italo-Austrian Treaty of April 28, 1923, on the following items of the Italian Tariff (see Annex A to the said Treaty):

#### IV.

The Kingdom of Italy waives claim to the conventional duty established by the Italo-Austrian Treaty of April 28, 1923, on the following item of the Austrian Tariff (see Annexe C to the said Treaty):

### It is understood that:

(a) Agricultural machines originating in and coming from Austria, of the types represented in the reproductions annexed to the present Protocol (see Annex A), will on importation into Italy be dutiable at the conventional rates established for "chaff cutters" in item 407 g) of the present Italian Tariff;

(b) Agricultural machines originating in and coming from Austria, of the types represented in the reproductions annexed to the present Protocol (see Annex B), will on importation into Italy be dutiable as presses and stampers for cereals at the conventional rate established in item 445 (b) of the present Italian Tariff, provided that the machines in question are used exclusively for pressing cereals and not for reducing them to flour.

### VI.

#### It is understood that:

(a) Olive oil in barrels, extracted by sulphide of carbon, included in item 83 of the present Austrian Tariff, shall be admitted duty-free, as provided in item 104 Annex C of the Italo-Austrian Treaty of Commerce of April 28, 1923, even when it contains up to 75 % of free fatty acids;

(b) Slices of anchovy preserved in oil, with capers, shall on importation into Austria

(b) Slices of anchovy preserved in oil, with capers, shall on importation into Austria be dutiable at the same rate as rolled anchovies preserved in oil, with capers, provided

for in item ex 107 (b) 2 of the present Austrian Tariff.

The present Additional Protocol shall be ratified and the instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at Rome as soon as possible. It shall come into force eight days after the exchange of the said ratifications and shall remain valid until the expiration of the Italo-Austrian Treaty of Commerce of April 28, 1923, to which it refers.

In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Protocol and have thereto affixed their seals.

Done at Rome in duplicate on the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

#### FINAL PROTOCOL.

On proceeding to sign the Additional Protocol to the Italo-Austrian Treaty of Commerce of April 28, 1923, concluded this day between Italy and Austria, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have made the following declarations, which shall form an integral part of the said Protocol:

It is understood that sparkling wines originating in and coming from Italy shall, on admission into Austria, be granted the most favourable Customs treatment which is or may in future be

accorded to sparkling wines originating in and coming from any third country.

The present Protocol, which shall without further special ratification be deemed to be approved and sanctioned by the actual exchange of ratifications of the Additional Protocol to which it refers, has been drawn up in duplicate at Rome on the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.
