MONSIEUR LE MINISTRE,

Acting on instructions from my Government, I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that — subject to reciprocity in respect of nationals of Monaco — Austrian nationals holding valid passports proving their nationality may, at any time, enter and leave the Principality of Monaco without a visa of a Monegasque authority being required.
