No. 3887. — SUPPLEMENTARY AGREEMENT 2 TO THE COMMERCIAL TREATY 3 OF DECEMBER 30TH, 1922, BETWEEN THE ECONOMIC UNION OF BELGIUM AND LUXEMBURG AND THE REPUBLIC OF POLAND. SIGNED AT BRUSSELS, MARCH 2ND, 1936.

French official text communicated by the Belgian Minister for Foreign Affairs. The registration of this Supplementary Agreement took place April 30th, 1936.

THE BELGIAN GOVERNMENT, acting both on its own behalf and on behalf of the Government of Luxemburg, in virtue of existing agreements, and the Polish Government, being desirous of developing commercial relations between the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg and the Republic of Poland, have agreed on the following provisions:

Article 1.

The natural and manufactured products originating in and coming from the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg enumerated in List A annexed to the present Agreement shall, on importation into Polish Customs territory, enjoy the benefit of the duties specified in that List.

Article 2.

The natural and manufactured products originating in and coming from the Polish Customs territory enumerated in List B annexed to the present Agreement shall, on importation into the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg, enjoy the benefit of the duties specified in that List.

Article 3.

Should the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg or the Republic of Poland find it necessary to impose duties or to increase one or more of the duties specified in Lists A and B respectively, it shall notify the other Contracting Party at least fifteen days before the aforesaid increase becomes effective.

The latter Party shall then be entitled to ask that negotiations be opened and may, if such negotiations do not result in an agreement, take the new situation into account so far as imports from the former Party are concerned.

Article 4.

The present Supplementary Agreement shall be substituted for the Supplementary Agreement¹s signed on June 10th, 1933, between the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg and the Republic of Poland.

It shall come into force on a date to be determined by mutual agreement between the Parties

and shall remain in force until December 31st, 1936.

If not denounced three months before its expiration, it shall be renewed by tacit consent, each Party then reserving the right to denounce it at any moment and it shall cease to be in force three months after its denunciation.

PROTOCOL OF SIGNATURE.

Ad Item 486 p. 2 (a) of the Polish Customs Tariff.

Viscose in sheets originating in and coming from the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg, even if imported under trade names such as "Sidac Paper", shall enjoy the benefit of the conventional duties specified for cellophane under item 486 p. 2 (a) of the Polish Customs tariff.

Ad Item 551 of the Polish Customs Tariff.

Finished bands for caps shall be included under this item.

Ad Item 730 ex p. 3 of the Polish Customs Tariff.

Pneumatic tyres with wired rims of dimensions of 33×4 and 28×4.5 o shall be granted Customs clearance as pneumatic tyres for wheels of horse-drawn vehicles. These dimensions together with the words "for cabs" must be moulded on the outer cover.

Machinery and Apparatus.

Machines and apparatus which are not made in the Polish Customs territory and which enjoy the benefit of tariff reductions under autonomous ordinances concerning reductions and exemptions from duty shall, on importation from the Union of Belgium and Luxemburg into the Polish Customs territory under the conditions in force for the application of autonomous tariff reductions, be subject to a duty equivalent to 20 per cent of the autonomous duty specified in column 2 of the Polish Customs tariff, with the exception of textile machines and apparatus, which are subject to a duty equivalent to 10 per cent of the autonomous duty specified in column 2 of the Polish Customs tariff.
