No. 4135. — ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT ² TO THE COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT OF JUNE 14TH, 1935, BETWEEN THE KINGDOM OF HUNGARY AND THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC. SIGNED AT PRAGUE, JUNE 15TH, 1936.

French official text communicated by the Chargé d'Affaires a.i. of the Permanent Delegation of the Czechoslovak Republic to the League of Nations and by the Chargé d'Affaires a.i. of the Hungarian Delegation to the League of Nations. The registration of this Additional Agreement took place June 28th, 1937.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC and HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF THE KINGDOM OF HUNGARY, desirous of further developing the commercial relations between the two countries, have resolved to supplement for this purpose the Commercial Agreement ³ of June 14th, 1935, between the Czechoslovak Republic and the Kingdom of Hungary by the following Additional Agreement, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

THE PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC:

His Excellency Monsieur Kamil Krofta, Minister for Foreign Affairs;

HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF THE KINGDOM OF HUNGARY:

His Excellency Monsieur Jean WETTSTEIN DE WESTERSHEIMB, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Prague;

Who, after having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:

1. The Czechoslovak Republic shall apply to the following articles of Hungarian origin the following duties:

3. The present Agreement forms an integral part of the Commercial Agreement of June 14th, 1935. It shall be ratified and the instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at Budapest as soon as possible.

It shall come into force 14 days after the exchange of ratifications.

The two Governments may, however, agree to put it into force provisionally even before ratification.

In faith whereof the undersigned, duly authorised for the purpose, have signed the present Additional Agreement.

Done in duplicate at Prague, this 15th day of June, 1936.

FINAL PROTOCOL

to the Additional Agreement to the Commercial Agreement of June 14th, 1935.

In proceeding to sign the Additional Agreement of to-day's date, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have made the following declarations, which shall form an integral part of the Additional Agreement:

Ad No. ex. 110 of the Czechoslovak Customs Tariff:

The certificates of origin concerning consignments of sparkling wines shall be issued by the competent Chambers of Commerce and Industry.

Ad No. ex. 119 of the Czechoslovak Customs Tariff:

Puszta or Pálpusztai cheeses shall be deemed to mean soft cheeses, well finished, covered with a reddish layer, made from whole milk and containing at least 45 per cent of fat in the dry matter, in the form of cubes or small bricks or the like, weighing between 50 and 220 grammes, and wrapped in tinfoil.
